

Missional communities are new shoots of the vine that offer alternative forms of worship and community. Dinner churches, nature churches, digital churches are all examples of different ways of "being church" that are being raised up here in New Hampshire. Since 2014 we have seen these new sprouts emerge in the form of communities such as Church of the Woods, The Mission in Franklin, The <u>Digital Mission</u>, and <u>Christ the Way</u> <u>Community</u>. Increased support for clergy and lay leaders and providing for gathering space and other assistance is critical to strengthen these communities.


