I will be leaving the church after our service on May 8th to travel and study in Israel followed by some much-needed family time. My three years with you have been both a serious challenge and an unexpected joy—the culmination of a long career as teacher and priest. There was much to learn in my coming to St. John the Baptist Church, and there is no way to measure what all of you have taught me. Being a parish priest, even for a short time, was a dream of mine since I was a young man, and I cannot thank you enough for the many, many ways you have nurtured this calling. I hope and pray that the next two months will give us time to reflect on the next steps for St. John the Baptist Church. It has truly been an honor and privilege to have served this wonderful parish. Timing is important, and I believe now is the right time for this transition to take place. Your vestry is made up of eight very talented members whose work is strengthened and supported by a committed fellowship of faithful parishioners. The mission of St. John the Baptist Church is solid, and the community of believers is capable and strong. This is an exciting time to build upon all we have accomplished over the past three years. The next two months will be a busy time as we work together to make this transition smooth and meaningful. We will receive professional help and guidance from the Diocese, both in the beginning and after my departure; but the real work will be yours as you imagine a new future for St. John the Baptist Church. It is not easy to be a disciple, but discipleship is the very heart of a church—people loving God and doing God's work in the world. My appointment here coincided with a project that imagined God's will to vastly expand our ministerial outreach, to be a church of "the right size." In our launch of that capital campaign, we said we wanted to "reach out to the community as well as meet the needs of a growing membership. We envision programs for the elderly as well as youth, Bible studies, the rekindling of discussion groups like "Wednesdays on the Hill," and, of course, St. John's regular community dinners. Now it is time to welcome the Holy Spirit who will inspire you to make your wider vision a reality. NEW LIFE The School for Ministry was launched in 2020 to develop leaders—both lay and ordained—called from throughout the region.
